

The North American Ice Service provides year-round maritime safety information on iceberg and sea ice conditions near the Grand Banks of Newfoundland and along the east coast of Labrador, Canada. In February 2011, the Canadian Ice Service and the International Ice Patrol began production of a joint daily iceberg analysis under the North American Ice Service. The iceberg limit is available via text bulletin and graphical chart (see below). Iceberg products are distributed through the World-Wide Navigational Warning Service.
