SUNSET OF NOAA PRINTED CHARTS

**** Cancellation of NOAA Paper and Raster Nautical Charts ****

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) is undertaking a multi-year program to end production and maintenance of its suite of over 1,000 traditional paper nautical charts and all associated raster chart products and services, including: Print-on-Demand (POD) paper nautical charts, Full-size chart PDF files, BookletChart[™] PDF files, NOAA raster navigational charts (NOAA RNC®), the NOAA RNC tile service, and the online RNC viewer. Six months notice of the intent to cancel a specific chart is provided in a "Last Edition" notice. The final cancellation of a chart is made in a

"Canceled" notice. Both types of notices will appear in LNM Section IV, "Chart Correction". A comprehensive list of all canceled NOAA charts is available at: http://www.charts.noaa.gov/MCD/Dole.shtml.

Traditional paper nautical chart production is ending to enable the creation and maintenance of larger scale, more up-to-date, higher guality coverage of NOAA's electronic navigational chart (NOAA ENC®) product. This will significantly enhance the amount of charted detail available to mariners. More information about NOAA's program to sunset traditional paper charts is on the NOAA Coast Survey website at: https://nauticalcharts.noaa.gov/charts/farewell-to-traditional-nautical-charts.html.

An online NOAA Custom Chart application at: https://devgis.charttools.noaa.gov/pod is available to create chart images from ENC data, which may then be printed. Notices to Mariners will not be issued for NOAA Custom Charts.

The U.S. Coast Guard COTP Ohio Valley has issued a low water Safety Advisory between approximate Miles 953.8 and 869.0. The USACE maintained depths and widths, may not be attainable on all buoy lines. It is recommended that mariners monitor all gauge readings, for safe navigation. The U.S. Coast Guard COTP Lower Mississippi River with the concurrence of the Lower Mississippi River Committee, recommend the following limits for tows:

Transiting southbound between Miles 953.8 and 869.0

Drafts no greater than 10.0 feet.

Barges to be configured no more than 6 wide total.

Transiting northbound between Miles 953.8 and 869.0

Drafts no greater than 9.5 feet.

Barges to be configured no more than 6 wide total, and loaded barges no more than 4 wide.

LOWER MISSISSIPPI RIVER - CHANNEL CONDITION/SAFETY ADVISORY - UPDATE

Barges currently in the system, with drafts greater than the advised depths, should be placed as near to the center of the tow as possible. Mariners are requested to contact U.S. Coast Guard Sector Ohio Valley via VHF-FM Channel 16 or at (502) 779-5425, to report areas of shoaling, hazardous conditions or missing aids to navigation.

UPPER MISSISSIPPI RIVER - ILLIONIOS RIVER - CHANNEL CONDITIONS/SAFETY ADVISORY Due to extreme low water, U.S. Coast Guard Sector Upper Mississippi River has issued a Safety Advisory for the Upper Mississippi River between Miles 185.4 and 109.9, and on the Illinois River Between Miles 0.0 and 187.0. Attached as an enclosure to this LNM is U.S. Coast Guard Sector Upper Mississippi River MSIB 05-23, extreme low water advisory.

November 13, 2023, through November 22, 2023. The River Chamber will be closed while a contractor places extensions on 6 floating mooring bitt tracks on the river wall of the River Chamber. Six mooring bitts will be removed during this work period, so the work can be staged for successful completion. The 2 mooring bitts adjacent to the miter gates will remain available on the river wall, and all mooring bitts will remain available on the middle wall. Mooring bitts should be replaced shortly after completion of the second closure. Project staff will make repairs to the miter gate machinery bases and miter gate skin sheet during the three closures. During the intermittent closures, all traffic will utilize the Land (1,200 ft) Chamber. Mariners should exercise caution when transiting the area and take all direction from the Olmsted L/D.

MILE 966.0 - MILE 975.0 - DREDGE OPERATION Continuing until approximately December 8, 2023, Amherst Madison, a contractor for the USACE, is conducting dredging operations downstream of Olmsted L/D, between approximate Miles 966.0 and 975.0. The contractor's floating plant will consist of the M/V LAWSON W. HAMILTON, M/V BUS BROWN, 2 barge-mounted cranes and 4 jumbo flat barges. Work will be conducted from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 a.m., 7-days a week. During nonworking hours, the contractor's floating plant will be moored at the worksite and lighted accordingly. The contractor's floating plant will monitor VHF-FM Channel 13. Mariners are urged to transit the area at their slowest safe speed to minimize their wake and proceed with caution after passing arrangements have been made.

Mile 975.0. Tows are not to meet, pass or overtake and are recommended to favor the center of the sail line. The preferred transit times for the area is daytime for southbound and nighttime for northbound. Northbound vessels are to check in with M/V LAWSON HAMILTON via VHF-FM Channel 16. Southbound vessels are to check in with Olmsted L/D via VHF-FM Channel 13.

Continuing until further notice, Lindy C. Boggs L/D 1 will be closed to assess and repair damage to the lower miter gate. Mariners may contact Lindy C. Boggs L/D 1 via VHF-FM Channels 12 and 16, or at (318) 253-8922, for further information. LNM: 40-23



This bulletin is used purely for informational purposes to assist the maritime community within the Sector Upper Mississippi River Area of Responsibility. Its purpose is to advise relevant parties of emerging information and situations that may impact our Marine Transportation System as well as facilitate cooperation among the involved parties regarding actions that we may be taking and/or that you may need to employ in the interest of safety/security.

Extreme Low Water Advisory for Sector Upper Mississippi River

The Captain of the Port Upper Mississippi River has issued a Safety Advisory for all waters of the Upper Mississippi River (UMR) from Mile Marker (MM) 185.4 TO MM 109.9 and the Illinois River (ILR) from MM 0.0 to MM 187 as a result of extreme low water conditions. This safety advisory is needed to protect vessels and mariners from hazards associated with low water, including possible shoaling and decreased channel widths. This safety advisory is effective immediately with the following provisions as listed in the Waterways Action Plan (WAP) Upper Mississippi River and Illinois River Annexes.

During periods of low water as listed in the low water watch phase of the WAP (*please refer to either the UMR* WAP or the ILR Annex for Low Watch and Low Action Water Levels for each zone) it is advised to take the following precautions:

- Advise deep draft vessels to depart any areas of low water with a reminder to transit at a slow speed near fleeting areas to minimize impact.
- Place heavy barges in the middle of a tow and be aware of shifting channels.

During periods of low water as listed in the low water action phase of the WAP it is advised to take the following precautions:

- Be aware of shifting channels, emergency dredging may be required at some locations.
- Consider restrictions on single skin barge movement.
- Be mindful of both barge and tender drafts to ensure a safe transit.

During periods of extreme low water as listed in the WAP it is advised to take the following precautions:

- Be prepared for severe restriction of navigation if conditions warrant.
- Fleeting may continue if conditions warrant.

Proactive risk mitigation strategies should be utilized to safely navigate in low water conditions. Operators should closely monitor river gauge readings while transiting pools and river systems. Owners, operators and port captains preparing barges must be mindful of the drafts, particularly anticipated under keel clearance, to ensure a safe transit.
